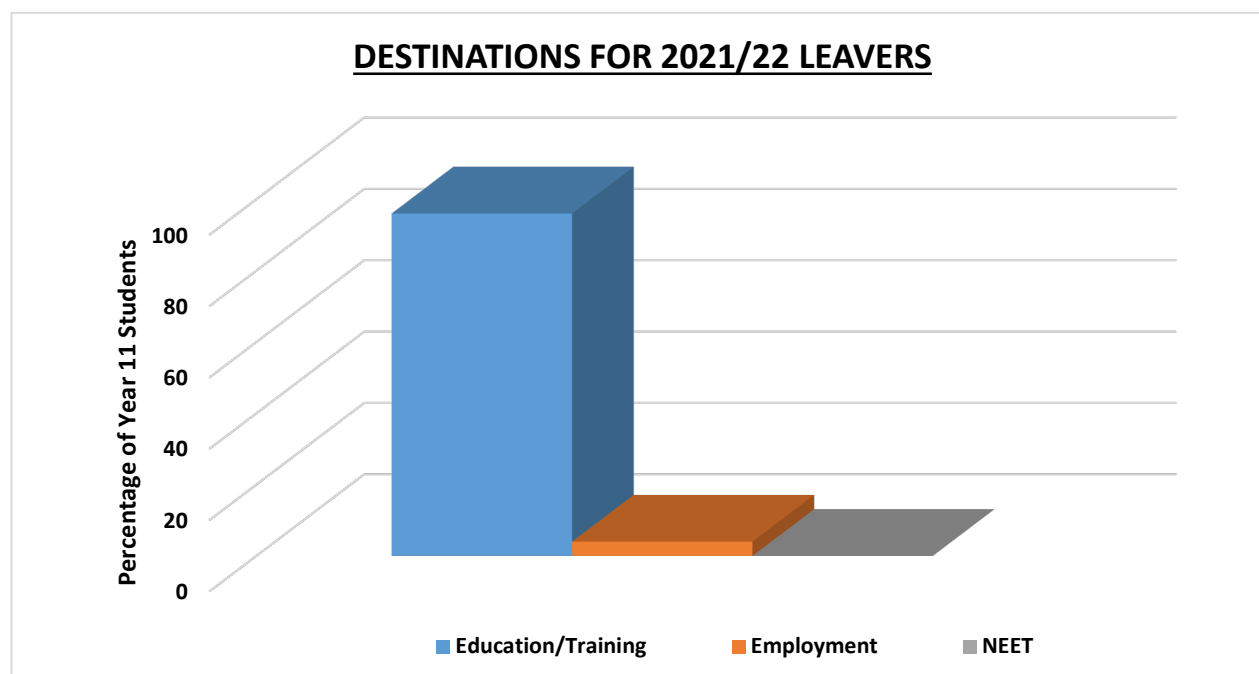


DESTINATIONS

Destinations of Year 11 students is given a very high priority due to the serious potential implications of these vulnerable students leaving the secure, supportive environment they have experienced at Everton Free School. These serious potential implications are for the individual students themselves, and also for the communities they live in.

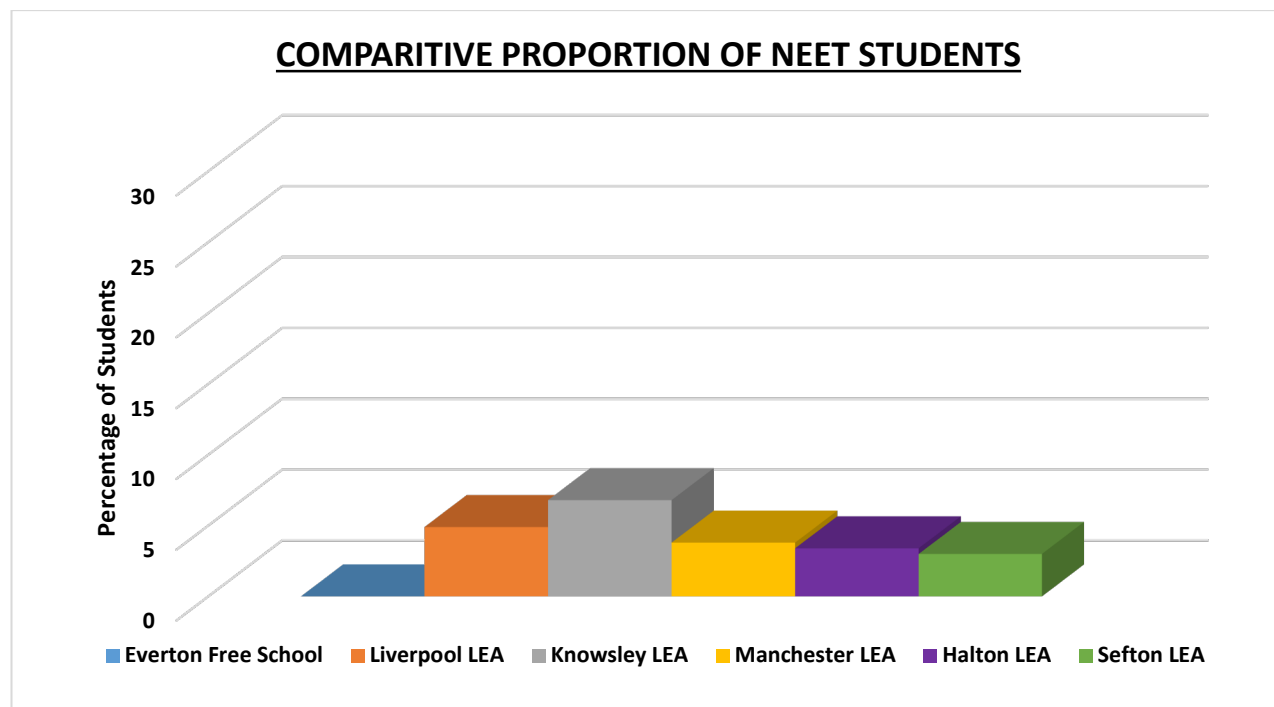
The table and chart below show the percentage of 2021/22 Year 11 students with destinations in education/training or employment. They also show the percentage of students that have failed to access education/training or employment, or whose destination is not known.

Destination Type	Percentage of Year 11 Students
Education/Training	96%
Employment	4%
NEET	0%



100% of Year 11 leavers in 2021/22 have known destinations in either education/training or employment. The vast majority of these are in

education/training. To have 0% of students not in education, employment or training (NEET) for such a highly vulnerable group is a quite remarkable achievement. This compares very favourably with the percentage of 16 and 17 year olds in other north west England local authorities who were NEET in August 2021, as shown in the chart below. Student destinations is a high priority for the A.P. Task Force which has been set up at the school, supported by government funding. Two mentors have been appointed specifically to work with potential NEET students. This has clearly been highly successful.
